The course is being closed for spraying a chemical treatment for the course that is very potent. This expensive premergent must be applied in late fall to be effective next spring to limit the growth of various weeds.

It is very imperative that no cart or foot traffic take place on the course for at least 24 hours after the spraying.

There will be volunteer marshals on the course to remind Waterwoodians about the situation.

Traffic will be limited to "**Cart Paths**" **only** on Saturday and Sunday, November 12th and 13th. Everyone is asked to cooperate in making this spraying a success.
